Welcome Spring and Easter with these cute door hangers. Hide sweet treats in the handy pocket on the back of the door hanger. This is a quick and easy project using your Brother ScanNCut and your Brother Sewing Machine.

Skill Level: Beginner

Time Required: 1 hour (or less)

Materials Required (for each door hanger)

- 2 pieces of felt 8.5" x 11" (for each door hanger)
- 2 pieces of co-ordinating fabric for the back pocket
- · Assorted fabric and felt scraps
- · Assorted buttons and other trim, as desired
- Coloured thread
- · Decorative ribbon
- Stabilizer
- · Iron-on fabric appliqué contact sheet
 - CASTBL1
- · Brother ScanNCut CM650CW
- · Brother Sewing Machine





Prepare fabric

1. Follow directions in package to adhere fabric appliqué backing to wrong side of all fabric to be cut at the ScanNCut.

cut the fabric

- To cut the egg shapes select, BA-A098 and enlarge to desired size. I enlarged to 10.45" x 8.56".
- 2. Cut 2 egg-shaped ovals for each door hanger.
- 3. Cut 2 egg-shaped ovals for the pocket.

The following ScanNcut designs were used

Flowers AR-A010

Butterfly AR-C021

Rabbit design is provided (bunny.fcm)

- 4. Lay prepared fabric on the ScanNCut mat.
- 5. Scan mat to determine placement of fabric and designs.
- 6. Arrange designs to cut where desired.
- 7. Press Cut.
- 8. Remove designs from mat.



Assemble Door Hangers

- 1. Arrange cut designs on right side of door hanger ovals.
- 2. Press in place.
- 3. To create a free-flowing stitch to connect the flowers, select stitch 1-03 and stitch a curved line from the top of the egg to the bottom of the egg. Position flowers as desired.
- 4. To attach buttons to middle of flowers, use the button attachment foot provided with your Brother Sewing machine, as desired.
- 5. Embellish door hangers with stick-on crystals. For example, the rabbit has crystal eyes and the butterflies are adorned with crystals.
- 6. For pockets, fold the top third of the pocket fabric oval to the wrong side on each of the 2 pocket pieces. Press the fold.
- 7. Layer the pocket pieces wrong sides together and stitch on the fold line, ¼ from the edge.
- 8. Place wrong sides of each main egg together and place the pocket fabric on the back side of the egg.
- 9. Select a blanket stitch and enlarge to desired size of stitch. (see figure 1)
- 10. Fold ribbon in half and place in the top of the egg. Pin in place.
- 11. Stitch around the outside of the egg. Start stitching at the bottom of the egg. You will be stitching through 2 layers of egg fabric and 2 layers of pocket fabric. (see figure 2)
- 12. Hang your egg on a door and welcome spring.


