

# Double-Sided Infinity Scarf

Stay warm in style with a double-sided infinity scarf. This version features faux leather closure detailing plus two different fabrics for added interest.

## MATERIALS REQUIRED



- Brother sewing machine (this project was made on the NQ900)
- Thread, black and clear
- Cotton, lightweight, black: 39" long (1 m)
- Cotton, lightweight, plaid: 39" long (1 m)
- 2 leather-look closures



# Double-Sided Infinity Scarf

## INSTRUCTIONS

### Cutting Fabric

1. Cut the black fabric so you have two long strips, each 11" wide (30 cm) x 39" long (1 m).



2. Repeat Step 1 for the plaid fabric.



# Double-Sided Infinity Scarf

## INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

### Assembly

3. Sew the two short ends of the plaid fabric together. Press the seam allowances flat and open.



4. Repeat Step 3 for the black fabric.



# Double-Sided Infinity Scarf

## INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

5. Lay the long strip of plaid fabric on top of the black fabric, right sides together, lining up the raw edges. Sew the fabrics together down one long side. Press the seam allowance flat and then toward one side.



6. Sew the other long side to create a tube. Press the seam allowance flat and then toward one side.



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## INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

7. Line up the raw edges of the two short sides of the tube with right sides together. Pin the fabrics together as much as you can.



8. Sew the short sides together as much as you can, leaving an opening about 5-7”.



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## INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

9. Fold under the remaining raw edges, and hand-sew the hole closed.



10. Drape the scarf to determine where you want the closures, and mark the placement with pins.



11. Put the closures in position, and keep them in place by hand or with adhesive tape.



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## INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

12. Using clear thread in the sewing machine and black thread in the bobbin, sew the faux leather closures in place on both sides of the infinity scarf.



13. To wear the scarf, loop it twice around your neck, adjusting the placement of the closures as desired.
