

Adult and Child Embroidered Turkey Aprons

Cook up Thanksgiving dinner in style with this fun turkey apron for adults and kids. Create all the shapes you need with your Brother ScanNCut and appliqué them into place using your Brother Sewing and Embroidery Machine. When you're done, embroider names on each apron for a special personalized touch. This is one holiday hostess gift they're sure to be thankful for!

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner
Time Required: 2 Hours (per apron)



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MATERIALS REQUIRED



- Brother Sewing and Embroidery Machine
- Brother ScanNCut CM650W
- Brother Middle Tack Adhesive Mat CAMATM12
- Brother Standard Cut Blade CABLDP1
- 2 meters of fabric for the aprons
(excluding turkey appliqués and ruffle trim)
- Assorted fabric scraps for the turkey appliqués and ruffle trim
- Brother Iron-on Stabilizer SA519
- Brother Embroidery Thread and Bobbin Thread
- 2 D-rings for each apron
- Iron-on Fabric Appliqué CASTBL1
- Brother Ruffler Foot SA565C

Note: This apron is lined so there's no need to add binding or hem the edges. Lining also gives the reverse side a clean finish. If you like, you can always make this apron with a single layer of fabric and finish its edges with a hem or binding. Remember to adjust your fabric measurements accordingly.

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INSTRUCTIONS

Cutting the Apron

1. Fold apron fabric in half.
2. Cut apron as follows – Measure and mark on fabric:
 - 35" long along the fold of fabric
 - 28" wide from fold to outer edge
 - 10" at upper bib
 - 12" down from edge of upper edge of bib to outer edge of fabric
 - Draw a curved cutting line from upper bib mark to side edge
3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 for apron lining.
4. Cut Pocket 16" x 16".
5. Cut strips of fabric for waist and neck ties. Approx. 30" x 2.5" for neck tie; 40" x 2.5" for waist tie for adult apron. Cut each strip in half – adjust to a shorter length for child apron.
6. Cut trim strip for pocket 16" x 2.5".
7. Cut trim strip for ruffle (if desired for child apron) 2" by 2 x desired length of hem.
8. Fold waist ties in half lengthwise and press, then fold each raw edge in toward the middle fold. Press. Stitch along the open edge and clean finish one end of each tie.
9. Complete step 8 for the neck tie.
10. Cut a 4" piece off the neck tie.

Cutting the Turkey Appliqué

1. Adhere fabric cutting adhesive to wrong side of appliqué fabric (as per package instructions).
2. Select the following shapes from built-in shapes on the ScanNCut, and size as indicated:

Turkey appliqué shape	ScanNCut pattern number	Size	Number required per Turkey
Feathers	BA A094	5" h x 3" w	8
Body	BA-A097	6" h x 3" w	1
Wings	BA-A090	4" h x 4" w	2
Beak	BA-A033	1.4" h x 1.66" w	1
Snood	BA-A094	1.5" h x 1" w	1

3. Position fabric on cutting mat.
4. Scan mat to determine placement.
5. Cut.

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INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

Assembly

1. Position the turkey appliqué shapes on the bib portion of the apron, starting with the feathers, then the body, then the wings.



2. Press to adhere.
3. Select your desired appliqué stitch on your Brother Sewing Machine (I used a blanket stitch). Stitch around the outside of each piece.



4. Thread two D-rings onto the 4" piece of neck tie. Fold in half, with the D-rings close to the fold. Stitch across the piece close to the D-rings.

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INSTRUCTIONS (CONT'D)

5. With the right sides together, position each piece of the neck tie at the top edge of the apron, one on either side and stitch in place.
6. Position waist ties in place, one on each side and stitch in place.
7. Stabilize and hoop pocket fabric for embroidery on pocket.
8. At embroidery machine, create name to be embroidered on pocket and stitch out.
9. Attach trim strip to top of apron pocket.
10. Fold pocket in half with right sides together and stitch both sides and bottom, leave room to turn, right side out.
11. Position pocket where desired on apron.
12. Stitch left and right side and bottom of pocket.
13. With right sides together, place lining on top of apron (making sure to tuck ties in between the layers).
14. Stitch around all sides of the apron leaving bottom edge open to turn to right side.
15. For adult apron - fold up hem and stitch in place.
16. For child apron - use the ruffler foot to create and attach the ruffle to the bottom of the apron.
The strip of fabric for the ruffle should be approx. 1.5 times the desired finished length of the ruffle.
